SHU WRITING SYSTEM

The Shu writing system is an alphabet written in syllable blocks. An example is shown below:

Below is a table that shows some (but not all) of the syllable blocks for the Shu alphabet. A syllable block can optionally start with a consonant, and then can have either two vowels, or a vowel and a consonant. As a result, what you see below is not the *full* set of syllable blocks:

When writing Shu, the syllable blocks are written from top to bottom and left to right, with punctuation marks coming in between, so it ends up looking a bit like this:
