Gwazaks Ankripton: The Kryptonian Writing System

The Kryptonian writing system is an abugida. For our system that means that a symbol on its own will stand for a single consonant or a consonant followed by the α vowel. The glyph will then take diacritics to form the other consonant-vowel combinations. Certain sequences will require more than one glyph. Below is a table which illustrates the various consonant and vowel combinations:
